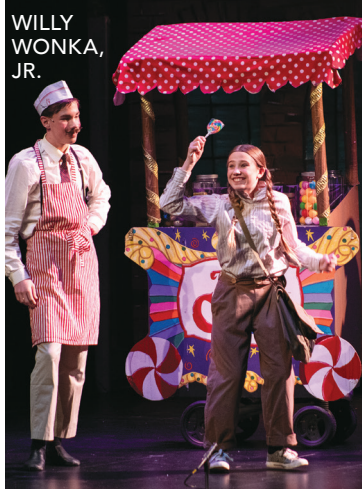

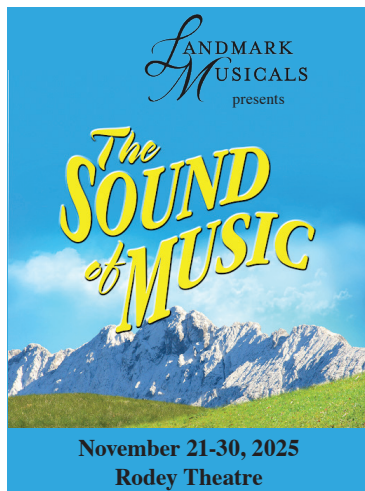

BreakingEven is an Albuquerque-based, all-level adult dance troupe made up of lifelong friends who are passionate about movement, creativity, and connectivity.

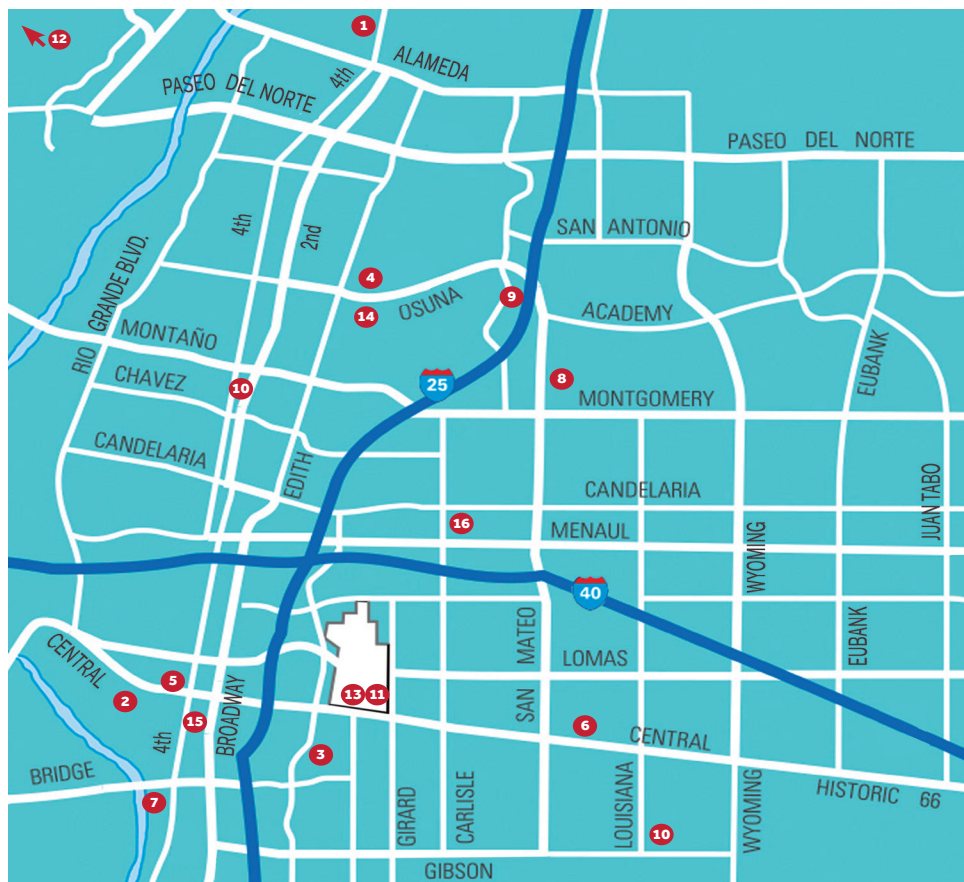
